Avish was an NSS student-athlete who was tragically taken from us in 2009. A wonderful, funny, intelligent and caring human being, Avish had gone back to India to look after his ailing grandfather – which was an expectation of him in his culture. Although Avish had many exciting plans academically and in his sport, he unselfishly put his whole life on hold to do this – to the surprise of no one. This is the kind of person Avish was. While riding his motorbike on a road in India, a young boy ran into the road, Avish swerved and dumped his bike to avoid the child, and was killed as a result. To honour the wonderful human Avish was, his family created the Avish Makol Memorial Award at the school. It goes to the student-athlete who best exemplifies all Avish represented.
